A Checklist to Guide You as You Start on Esbriet

Follow these steps to help you start your Esbriet treatment:

1. Learn about Esbriet and sign up for support services.

2. Confirm your insurance coverage.

- Answer or return all calls from Esbriet Access Solutions to confirm your coverage.

3. Apply for financial assistance.

- Talk to Esbriet Access Solutions about patient assistance options.

4. Confirm delivery of Esbriet.

- Answer and return all calls from your specialty pharmacy to confirm shipment.

Select Important Safety Information

Before you take Esbriet, tell your doctor about all of your medical conditions, including if you:

- have liver problems
- have kidney problems
- are a smoker
- are pregnant or plan to become pregnant. It is not known if Esbriet will harm your unborn baby.
- are breastfeeding or plan to breastfeed. It is not known if Esbriet passes into your breast milk. You and your doctor should decide if you will take Esbriet or breastfeed.

Tell your doctor about all the medicines you take, including prescription and over-the-counter medicines, vitamins, and herbal supplements.

What should I avoid while taking Esbriet?

- Sunlight. Esbriet can make your skin sensitive to the sun and the light from sunlamps and tanning beds. You could get a severe sunburn. Use sunscreen (SPF 50) and wear a hat and clothes that cover your skin if you have to be in sunlight. Talk to your doctor if you get sunburn or a rash.
- Taking Esbriet with other medicines that can make your skin sensitive to the sun, the light from sunlamps and tanning beds.
- Smoking. Smoking may affect how well Esbriet works.

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What are the possible side effects of Esbriet?

Esbriet may cause serious side effects, including:

- liver problems.** Call your doctor right away if you have unexplained symptoms such as yellowing of your skin or the white part of your eyes (jaundice), dark or brown (tea-colored) urine, pain on the upper right side of your stomach area (abdomen), bleeding or bruising more easily than normal, or feeling tired. Your doctor will do blood tests to check how your liver is working during your treatment with Esbriet.
- sensitivity to sunlight (photosensitivity) and rash.** See “What should I avoid while taking Esbriet?”
- stomach problems.** Esbriet may cause stomach problems such as nausea, vomiting, diarrhea, indigestion, heartburn, and stomach pain. Tell your doctor right away if your stomach problems get worse or do not go away. Your doctor may need to change your dose of Esbriet.

The most common side effects of Esbriet include feeling tired, insomnia, upper respiratory tract infections, sinusitis, headache, dizziness, decreased weight and decreased or loss of appetite. These are not all the possible side effects of Esbriet.

About Esbriet

Esbriet is a prescription medicine used to treat people with a lung disease called idiopathic pulmonary fibrosis (IPF). It is not known if Esbriet is safe and effective in children.

Confirm Your Insurance Coverage



Many people have concerns about treatment costs. Rest assured that Esbriet is covered by most health insurance plans.¹ However, it is important you understand your specific health insurance benefits and plan restrictions.

- ▶ **Esbriet Access Solutions** is a program that helps people who are taking Esbriet. It can find out:
 - ▶ If your health insurance plan covers Esbriet
 - ▶ How much your co-pay will be

- ▶ **Sometimes your health insurance plan needs more information** before it will cover Esbriet. This is called a "prior authorization." Esbriet Access Solutions has resources to help you and your doctor with prior authorizations.

Apply for Financial Assistance



Even with health insurance, you may still have concerns about treatment costs.

If you are eligible, there may be options to help you pay for Esbriet:

- ▶ Referrals to the Esbriet \$5 Co-pay Program[‡]
- ▶ Referrals to independent co-pay assistance foundations[§]
- ▶ Referrals to the Genentech® Access to Care Foundation, or GATCF^{||}

Schedule Delivery of Esbriet



Esbriet is a specialty drug. It will be delivered to your home from a specialty pharmacy. You cannot pick it up from your local drugstore.

- ▶ This specialty pharmacy will call up to 3 times to schedule delivery of Esbriet
- ▶ Be sure to answer this call and work with the pharmacy to schedule the shipment for a time when you will be home

If you do not have insurance, you must meet different financial criteria.

Schedule follow-up appointments with your doctor to:

- ▶ Complete blood tests to check how well your liver is working during your treatment with Esbriet

- ▶ Discuss any side effects you are having and how to manage them
